Here's all you need to do:

1. Call the Kirkwood Meadows Public Utility District at (209) 258-4444 Ext. 3 to add your address to the list. We will need your name, address and phone number.
2. Cut brush and limbs should be stacked within **5 feet of the road edge**, with cut ends facing towards the road, no higher than 4 feet. The chipper can take material **up to 5 inches** in diameter. **Pile in windrows like firewood, not heaped like a beaver dam.** Keep materials **free of mud, rocks, wire** or other items. Do not stack in the road, fire hydrants, culvert area or in any way impede normal traffic on the road.
3. **All chipped material will be returned to owner's property or near location of pile.**
4. Natural material only, no building debris. Material that is stacked incorrectly will not be removed. **Materials that cannot be chipped for any reason will not be removed and left behind for the owner to remove.**
